

HE UI, HE NĪNAU. E UI AKU ANA AU IĀ ‘OE

‘Ula‘ula

Mahalo no ke
komo ‘ana i ka
ho‘okūkū.

‘Alaea- Flesh like redness, especially the dark red meat close to the spine of some fish, as of the aku. Red, as the flesh of the aku and ahi. (Kumu Ili)



‘Ehu- Reddish tinge in hair, of Polynesians and not of Caucasians; one with ‘ehu hair; reddish-brown complexion said to be characteristic of some ‘ehu people; ruddy. (Kumu Naoli)



‘Ena- Red-hot, glowing, raging, as fire; epithet of an oven when red hot. Applied also to anger. To burn, as fire; ua ‘*ena* loa ka ‘ula o ka ma‘i, the sick person is red with heat. (Kumu Stephnie)
