MA KE KULA DISTANCE LEARNING

Hua 'ōlelo

With our island of Hawai'i in the yellow zone, change is in the air at Ka 'Umeke Kā'eo. Here is some vocabulary to help you understand the different types of learning that may be happening. Distance Learning

Involves teachers working with students from different physical locations. Instruction may be synchronous or asynchronous based on student's needs. You'll likely rely on digital forms of communication such as messaging apps, video calls, and discussion boards. Distance learning includes the use of digital and/or printed materials.

Online Learning

Includes content that is delivered and accessed online. This may involve recorded videos, ebooks, etc.

Face-to-Face Learning

Involves delivering content in-person. If technology is used, it would be purposefully integrated with educational technology and digital lessons.

Hybrid/Blended Learning

Involves using a variety of instructional resources and teaching methods in order to deliver content in-person and via distance learning.

Asynchronous Learning

Asynchronous learning occurs through online collaboration tools without real-time interaction such as discussion boards and blogs. There is no real-time interaction.

Synchronous Learning

Synchronous learning occurs through online collaboration tools that happen in real-time such as Google Meet, Cisco Webex, and Zoom. Synchronous learning refers to a learning event in which a group of participants is engaged in learning at the same time.
